Intent/Justification

URGENT CRISIS: The two Rainbow C.O.R.E (Trauma focused consultation, onsite observation, resources and education) grants that the Rainbow Project had acquired from the Madison Schools Foundation and Attic Angel Assn., through 2012 and 2013 will end Dec. 2013. Attempts to obtain continued funding from other sources have not been achieved to date. We are looking for stop gap funding for the CORE program until future funding can be secured. 64% of Rainbow's current caseload is from Dept. of Human Services involved children and families. We have received referrals for children and families experiencing severe domestic violence, including homicide, suicide, community violence, child sexual abuse drug endangered children. Actual funding amount needed to replace lost funds is \$30,000. We would like to request an additional \$10,000 for a total of \$40,000 to expand the program. We propose serving 100-150 young children in 4 year old kindergarten and elementary school ages working in partnership with the schools special services team. Success from this piloted project include letters of support from both the Madison Schools and the 4K coordinators. Trauma-informed mental health services are for children in selected Madison/Dane Co Schools and the new 4 year old Kindergarten programs throughout the County. The National Trauma Network indicates that young children are most at risk for developing post-traumatic stress disorder. Specialized child/family centered evidence-based interventions will help reduce the risk of more serious mental health, academic, behavioral, medical, criminal problems from occurring. Younger and younger aged children are being suspended, expelled from school, early childhood programs due to the impact of trauma on their brain development and neurobiology. Timely, appropriate responses are essential. 10% of all new referrals each month are children and families who are homeless.
