Services provided by the ADRC are free and available to all Dane County residents regardless of income or assets.



Case Management

A contracted service of the Area Agency on Aging (AAA) of Dane County, this program provides older adults support they need to achieve and maintain optimum independence in their community through the assessment of needs and the coordination and monitoring of community-based services. Case managers work at all 12 Senior Focal Points. To learn more about this program, click here.

Case managers are available by phone and email to provide information, resources, and support. They are continuing to call their clients to ensure the clients' needs are being met. Face-to-face home-visits are conducted on an extremely rare occasion. Older adults should contact their case manager or Senior Focal Point if they have any questions or concerns.

Caregivers

Caregiver grants are no longer available for 2020. Contact Dane County Caregiver Coordinator Jane de Broux (Debroux.Jane@countyofdane.com or 261-5679) for grants starting 1/1/21. Although the grant program is closed, Jane is doing a lot of "listening," caregiver support, referrals to the Respite Care Association of Wisconsin and other resources, and talking about other caregiver-related issues. Struggling caregivers who need support, should contact Jane.

The Music Therapy for Older Adults & Caregivers Program is currently full but will start up in January 2021.

Transportation Services

Dane County Transportation Call Center 242-6489 (Monday-Friday)

Medical Appointments (door-to-door)

Leave name & phone number; staff will return call & obtain details (NOTE: RSVP Driver Escort is not providing medical rides; Road to Recovery is no longer providing volunteer drivers to transport people to cancer treatments.)

Food Resources (door-to-door)

Dane County Delivers: Senior Grocery Solutions is a new program where volunteers shop for groceries and Transit Solution/Care Van Service delivers groceries to homes. Grocery shopping trips continue but in small groups (maximum 2 people), numerous trips available each day.

Take-out Meal Delivery: transportation available to deliver meals to homebound older adults.

Food/Supply Delivery): transportation available to deliver packages of food/supplies (limited areas).



Donations

Volunteers & Supplies are needed

Food Resources: package and/or deliver home-delivered meals and food pantry groceries; shop and deliver groceries to home-bound older

adults; distribute curbside meals

Cleaning & Hygiene Supplies: donate, package & deliver

Face Coverings: make and deliver cloth masks

Many agencies serving older adults were forced to cancel in person fundraising events for this year due to the pandemic. This is has made a major impact on their budgets and reduced their ability to provide services and programs that will in turn affect the ability of older adults to live independently and safely in their own homes.




Social Isolation video

Through phone calls and emails, staff and volunteers from Focal Points and RSVP are offering a variety of opportunities to address social isolation. Older adults should contact their <u>Senior Focal Point</u> or RSVP (238-7787) to learn more about these efforts.

Volunteers will connect with older adults to provide online socialization and physical and mental exercises. Contact DCDHS Dementia Crisis Program Specialist Joy Schmidt (Schmidt.Joy@countyofdane.com or 286-8183) to sign up to volunteer, make a referral, or register for this program.

<u>Updated Social Isolation Resource Guide</u> is a tool to help combat social isolation and loneliness in older adults. It includes resources covering the following topics: wellness calls, physical activity, brain health, entertainment, positivity, and social connections.



Elder Benefit Specialists

Provides free advocacy and legal advice and/or representation for older adults (age 60+) who are faced with benefit, housing and other disputes or denials, complications, changes in benefits, insurance claims not paid, and other similar issue groups that have an economic or socially isolating effect on the older adult. Referrals for this program are through the ADRC.
