



Caregiver Program: Data

- Dane County African American & Latinx older adults (age 55+)
- Reduces isolation among African American & Latinx older adults
- Identifies barriers & assists in removing obstacles
- Centers around socialization & building community
- Limited transportation





Cultural Diversity Program



- Free advocacy, legal advice and/or representation
- Face benefit, housing & other disputes or denials
- Complications, changes in benefits, insurance claims not paid...
- Economic or socially isolating effect
- Prioritize legal case work-client need & available resources

Volunteer Guardianship & Rep Payee Program



Contracted with RSVP of Dane County, this program matches older adult volunteers (age 60+) with opportunities to serve throughout Dane County, The volunteer's talents, interests, and schedules are considered to ensure a successful match.

Volunteer Recruitment & Placement

There are three additional Senior Centers located in Dane County that are not contracted by the County—for various reasons.

Madison Senior Center

Owned & operated by City of Madison

Located in service area of NewBridge, which provides case management services and operates a congregate senior dining site

Monona Senior Center

Owned & operated by City of Monona

Located in service area of NewBridge, which provides case management services

Verona Senior Center

Owned & operated by City of Verona

Located in service area of Sugar River, which provides case management services Also provides case management services and offers congregate & HDM meals but is not contracted by AAA for these programs


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
