U.S. Passport Application



To apply for a U.S. passport, there are specific requirements depending on whether you're applying for a passport for the first time, renewing an existing one, or applying for a child. Below are the general requirements for a firsttime applicant.

1. Proof of U.S. Citizenship
 Certified U.S. Birth Certificate (must be an original or a certified copy from the state or local government, showing your name, date of birth, and place of birth). Previous U.S. Passport (if applicable, for minors or adults who are renewing a passport). Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA) (for those born overseas to U.S. citizen parents). Naturalization Certificate or Certificate of Citizenship (for those who became U.S. citizens after birth).
2. Proof of Identity
 □ Valid Government-Issued ID (such as a state-issued driver's license, military ID, or a previous passport). □ Photocopy of ID (both front and back of the ID).
Note: If you don't have an ID, you may need to provide additional documents, such as a birth certificate and a recent photograph, to establish identity.
3. Passport Photo
 A recent, color photograph of yourself that meets the U.S. passport photo requirements. The photo should be 2x2 inches, with a white or off-white background, showing your full face (no hats or glasses unless for medical reasons).
4. Passport Application Form

- Form DS-11: This form is used for first-time applicants or individuals who do not meet the criteria for a passport renewal. It can be filled out online or on paper.
 - Do not sign the form until instructed by a passport acceptance agent.
 - o The **DS-11** form can be found online at the U.S. Department of State's website.

5. Payment

You must pay the passport application fee. The fees may vary based on the type of passport (e.g., 10-year or 5-year passport), and whether you want expedited processing.

- For adults (16 and older): \$130 for a passport book.
- o For minors (under 16): \$100 for a passport book.

Payment can usually be made via check, money order, or credit/debit card, depending on the facility.

6. Submission

First-time applicants must apply in person at an authorized passport acceptance facility (e.g., post office, library, or courthouse). You will need to submit the completed DS-11 form, along with all necessary documentation and payment.

7. Additional Requirements for Minors

If you are applying for a child's passport (under 16 years old), both parents must typically be present to give consent, or you must provide a notarized statement of consent from the non-applying parent. A birth certificate showing both parents' names is usually required.

Expedited Passport Service (if needed)

If you need a passport more urgently, you can request expedited processing for an additional fee. Expedited processing usually takes 2-3 weeks, but there are also emergency appointment services for critical travel situations.

Renewal (if you already have a U.S. passport)

If you're renewing a passport (it's expired or close to expiring), you can often do this by mail. You'll need to complete **Form DS-82** instead of DS-11 and submit your most recent passport.
